



Very gently undulating landscape with long open views across the central area of the LDU and more initmate views to the western/southern and eastern edges. Sunken roads around Papplewick with views enclosed by linear woodlands and tall hedges, a strong characteristic of a portion of this LDU. Electrical pylons and the A60 are strong visual detractors. A variety of woodlands of medium scale which are either coniferous or deciduous not mixed, the former being plantations. Also smaller woodlands and linear woodlands to roads. Linear hawthorn hedges - many well managed around arable farmlands. Roadside hedges have many more species hawthorn/beech/sycamore/hazel/elm/elder with Oaks as hedgerow trees. Stonewalls around Papplewick. Gorse and bracken in higher areas.

Linear ribbon development is characteristic throughout the LDU such as near to Ravenshead - Longdale Lane, and along the A60.

North eastern section seems to be deteriorating in character (north of Longdale Lane) Loss of hedgerows to fields but replanting scheme in progress along north easr road edge.

The main threat is the intensification of the urban fringe uses in the southern section and their incursion into the central section northwards or southwards as an extension of the golf course use.

Land use is predominantly arable farming from small isolated farms. No woodland with very few isolated mature trees e.g. Farnsfield Farm. Medium regular field pattern with predominantly hawthorn hedges that are poorly managed in some stretches resulting in gaps. Some small hedgerow trees in field and road hedges of ash or oak or Sweet Chestnut. Dismantled railway is apparent in the area as a scrubby bank with bracken and some small trees. The southern edge of the area contains some residential use in the form of ribbon development to the west of Farnsfield. A concentration of low key tourist and retail uses is found around the White Post Farm roundabout. Threats include changes in farming practice and loss of hedgerows or decline in farming use resulting in loss or changes of use of farm buildings. Other threats include the expansion of the low key tourist and retail uses and of residential uses at Farnsfield.



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

Gently undulating landform with some views constrained by woodland and landform but some longer views out to the fringe of Bilsthorope. Land use dominated by arable farming with the northern section consisiting of an area of intensified farming and development of packing/processing facilities. Pattern of small mid 20th farmhouses. Area has only one small area of plantation woodland and lacks hedgerow trees. Trees only found in association with farmhouses and as linear features or shelter belts along farm tracks. Hedgerows consist only of hawthorn internally with elder/hazel/gorse along hedges to the main roads. Buildings associated with the intensified farming are relatively large industrial sheds but cannot be seen from outside of the area. The main threat to the area is the intensification of the processing/packaging side which may bring more or larger buildings and the intensificiation of farming generally resulting in loss of hedgerows and the small farms that remain.

Overall Character Summary Statement

Area consists of the narrow valley of the water course known as Rainworth Water, this opens out at some points to form a narrow floodplain. The landform falls gradually to the north. Views are limited in the southern section by coniferous and deciduous woodland, in the central section views are open, in the northerm section there are views north-south but limited by wooded slope to east and landform to west. Landuses include broadleaved woodland in southern section, central section is culverted through area of intensive arable cultivation, northern section is also intensive arable cultivation but water course is above ground here. No woodland in central section, some parkland trees in northern section and woodland of cutt's wood on ridge to east, much removal of hedgerow in central and northern area to form large fields. Some tourism and residential landuse within Rufford estate. Little remains of historic pattern in the southern and central areas although there are remnants of parkland landscape to the north. Overall Character Summary Statement

The underlying gently undulating landscape has been considerably altered by mineral workings and internal views are contained by the landform, both by remaining natural features and restored landform. Area supports a wide range of land uses including nature reserves, ongoing mineral workings and some urban fringe uses. A large coniferous woodland dominates the central section of the area but there is a fringe of broadleaved to some sections and other smaller broadleaved woodlands. The historic pattern of the area is no longer evident with the only remaining pattern being the coniferous woodland parcels. The main threats to the area are due to its being on the urban fringe as it is accessible for fly tipping, vandalism and quad biking. The mixture of uses makes it unlikley that an overall development plan or management regime will be applied to the area. Some increase in informal recreation uses may bring improvements e.g connectivity and management.

Description

The major landuse is the restored mineral workings of Clipstone colliery, part of which has been reclaimed to form Vicar Water Country Park.Rufford Colliery is still in process of restoration but slopes of both spoil tips have been planted with mixed forestry plantations. Sherwood Forest Golf course forms a deciduous wooded area with the course managed with heathland restoration and bio diversity objectives. Mansfield Rugby club on Eakring road is within the LCP. Agricultural land consists of arable fields around Newlands Farm to the north and some horse paddocks on the northern edge of Rainworth.The LCP also contains Crown Farm Industrial Estate with newer development to the north of the estate and older development to the south of the estate with some vacant areas of amenity and unimproved grassland. The LCP also contains Ransom Wood Business Park set into area of Victorian parkland landscape, also Ratcher Hill disused sand quarry.There is some encroachment of new housing from the southern edge of Clipstone into the LCP. A small sections of the Strawberry Hill coniferous plantation woodland is contained within this LCP although the majority lies in LCP s20.

Overall Character Summary Statement

The modified landform of the restored colliery spoil tips forms the core of this area with some steeply sloping former spoil tips, the remainder of the landform is gently undulating. Views to the east and south are teminated by woodland, views to the west and north are closed by the urban areas of Mansfield and Clipstone. The landuse is very varied the majority being the restored Clipstone colliery, and Rufford Colliery which is in the process of reclamation. Sherwood Forest Golf course forms a large area of interlocking deciduous woodland which is being managed to encourage heathland. The are significant areas of plantation mixed woodland to the restored spoil tips and spoil tips under restoration, and many other smaller areas of woodland. There is an area of parkland woodland around Ransom Wood. Much of the area was formerly shown as open heathland on the Sanderson plan. The main threat to the area is residential growth and industrial development and possible new road connections to the MARR route.



Overall Character Summary Statement

An undulating rounded landscape with Clipstone Drive forming a very small ridgeline going south west to north east. From this there are views back to the edge of Clipstone and winding towers to the south east and woodland plantions to the north. There are areas of rough grass land with bracken in the hedgerows and rosebay willow herb in the fields between Newlands Wood and Cavenish Wood. To the west the fields were made up of arable crops of sugar beet, carrots as well as uncultivated areas dominated by Worm wood. There are several footpaths cutting across the valley in an approx. north/south direction. The area is used by walkers and horse riders and there is an area of pony paddocks around Cavenish Lodge and Warren Farm. The area is criss crossed by power lines and there are two telephone masts.

Overall Character Summary Statement

The LCP consists of a strongly undulating landform falling from a central ridge at 117 m, to the north west and to the south east to the Maun Valley. There are long distance open views bounded by wooded skylines to the west, north and east. The urban fringe of Mansfied dominates the views to the south. Landuse is predominately arable with cereals but also vegetable crops and grazing nearer to the Maun valley. Approx 25% of the land area consists of coniferous forestry. There are isolated farms throughout the area and a small area of residential settlement at Spion Cop. The field boundaries are intact with Oak and Ash trees to hedgerows. The agricultural pattern has changed due to removal of field boundaries shown on the Sanderson plan leading to the development of irregular medium sized fields. The main threats are the spread of the Mansfield residential area to the north east and possible changes in the forestry area either by removal of trees or expansion of the area, as well as hedgerow removal.



The LCP is generally gently undulating although with some steeper areas to the east and west. Views are contained by close woodland to the east and west and by more distant woodland to the south. Views north are constrained by landform. Landuse is varied consisting of coniferous plantations and deciduous woodland with both arable and pasture areas. Babworth Park forms the central area and includes woodland, parkland and grazing areas. There is also a major development area to the east of Babworth Park and a golfcourse to Whisker Hill in the south as well as a variety of transport routes. There is also a cemetery to the western fringes of Retford. Woodland is coniferous around New Plantation and mixed deciduous around Ordsall and Babworth Hall including mature trees

The major threats to the area are further removal of hedgerow boundaries.development pressure on existing woodlands, decline in condition of Babworth Parkland particularly mature parkland trees without adequate maintenance and other deciduous woodland, also changes in forestry and agricultural practice leading to change in cropping patterns, and type of crop.

Historic Pattern - Description The Sanderson Plan field pattern has been changed by much hedgerow removal particularly to the western area of LCP which was formerly many small fields, the central area of parkland landscape has become less apparent although remnants including the avenue and isolated trees remain. Much of Scrofton Wood which was once connected to Rayton Angle has been lost. Some Sanderson woodland boundaries remain such as East Thievesdale Wood but the shelter belt planting is a more recent addition.								
Threats include further loss of historic pattern due to hedgerow removal, further removal of Sanderson woodland boundary pattern as well as the woodlands themselves, changes in the degree of coniferous planting within LCP, decline in condition of mature trees including parkland and avenue trees.								

The landform across the LCP is gently undulating and slopes down to the River Ryton valley to the south and east. There are open views to distant wooded skylines and to the south the landform falls away and is well wooded around Osberton Hall, there is some interuption of the medium distance views by thin shelter belts of Scots Pine. The landform falls away to the south to the wooded valley around Osberton Hall outside the LCP. Landuse consists of arable farming with some grazing of sheep and cattle on improved pasture. There is only isolated residential settlement associated with farm properties. There was formerly an airfield to the centre of this area but this has now been grassed over. Woodland consists of small deciduous woodlands with a high proportion of Oak and small clumps of coniferous woodland. The thin Pine belts are a distinct visual feature of the LCP. Road hedge boundaries are well maintained hawthorn, internal field boundaries are maiinly post and wire fences. There is a remnant avenue and isolated parkland trees. The main threats to the LCP are futher removal of hedgerows, this has already been extensive. There may be changes in degree of afforestation or removal of existing deciduous woodland due to farm intensification. Mature trees, the remnant avenue and road side hedgerows may decline due to poor maintenance and management.

This area of land lies north east of Clipstone with a farly flat and low lying valley. Vicar Water is currently dry (September 05) although the course is apparent in places where it resembles a ditch. Field boundaries run at right angles to this and are largely rough grazing for cattle and sheep. Barbed wire fencing and timber post and wire fencing is common in this area. To the south is Clipstone coillery aswell as several lines of power lines and pylons. The remains of King Johns Palace lie within a field to the north east corner of the landcover parcel. There are several scattered residential houses, Clipstone village itself and a few farm buildings. There is some industrial buildings around Baulker Lane and off the B6030. There are horses around Cavendish Farm and several bridleways and footpaths through this area.

The LCP is characterised by a gently undulating landform sloping from west to east. There is a central open area of agricultural use with the remainder as coniferous plantation or mixed deciduous woodland. The farmed area consists of mixed pasture and arable landuses with a small area of caravan parking adjacent to the farm. The deciduous woodland has Birch as the dominant species. Field boundary hedges very poorly defined but are being replaced. There are isolated trees to the field boundaries and edges of the Old Coach Road. The pattern of woodland areas is as shown on the Sanderson plan in the Clumber Park area but the agricultural area has been enclosed from heathland since 1835. Threats to the area include further changes in pattern due to extension of the woodland areas or further creation of a new field pattern.

River Ryton follows a narrow flood plain from Blyth to Worksop. Chesterfield Canal runs through LCP in the South. Outer edge of flood plain has a height of 20 ms. River has a height of 14ms. Generally open views out of LCP into open farmland. Osberton Park has shorter distance views obscured by parkland and woods.

Within Worksop, development encloses LCP giving shorter views. New housing development features within Worksop in the floodplain. Scrubby wasteland with warehousing on Worksop outskirts. Pastoral land use to river's edge from Worksop outskirts to Osberton Park (MLA) which features sheep grazing within historic parkland. Trees include, Oak, Birch, Sweet Chestnut, Beech, pastoral and arable land use features futher north with deciduous woodland holts and more recent Poplar stands. Roadside hedgerows are well maintained hawthorn with some mature Oak trees featuring. Stone walled bridges cross the water and there are post and wire fencing around grazing areas.

Electric cables run through north of area. Various tracks and paths/bridleways run through the area. Railway crosses LCP to East of Worksop. B6045, and a few minor roads in Worksop cross the area.

Osberton Park features fully mature parkland trees, avenues and woodland which may decline in condition if not managed. River side Holts (which are SINCs) are possibly liable to flood damage and under pressure from surrounding landuses. Further removal or deterioration of farm track hedgerows is possible, the Poplar stands could increase or be removed. Stone bridges are vulnerable to pressure of modern farm traffic.



Generally undulating landform with the distinctive steep sided feature of Hamilton Hill, the valley of Cauldwell Brook and Kingsmill Reservoir are within the area. Views out are closed by woodland, urban fringe uses andd landform. Landuses varied within but include agricultural uses,mainly set aside with a small area of pasture to the north east, fringe of horsiculture to edge of Mansfield and Sutton in Ashfield, also industrial development of Oakham Business Park, also reservoir and associated recreational activity, isolated farms are the only residentail use. Only woodland is a strong fringe to Oakham Buisness Park and a fringe to the reservoir. Some strong, mature road hedge boundaries with trees particularly along Cauldwell Road, internal hedgerow boundaries present but gappy and poorly maintained. Major transport route of MARR now passes trhough centre of LCP, historic pattern is breaking down due to pressure for development but remnants of the older landscape exists in small areas. The main threat to the area is development pressure along the MARR route and from spread of edges of Mansfield southwards and the Maun valley industrial estate northeastwards.

The coniferous tract of woodland across the centre of the site is the dominant tree cover, with small pockets of characteristic Sherwood species on the golfcourse. Hedgerow trees are liimited to those field boundaries along the roadsides. The field pattern to the north is very similar to that of the Sanderson's Map, whilst boundaries to the south have been obliterated by the golf course. The greatest threat to the character of the area would be a change in the management practices of the golf course (which are currently quite sympathetic to biodiversity objectives).




